

Your fortnightly note from your Headteacher ...

Firstly, a huge thank you to all for your continued communication, support and understanding over what has been a very challenging week regarding COVID-19 cases in school.

I realise it is a very worrying time for all and priority is of course keeping everyone as safe as possible. As you know we have had multiple cases - 7 positive cases and earlier this week we advised the whole of Class Bolton to have PCR tests. We have been liaising with NYCC Public health and are doing everything we can in school to reduce the possibility of further transmission, we politely ask you to be mindful of this outside of school too. If in any doubt that your child may have symptoms, please don't hesitate to book them a PCR test. Doing regular lateral flow tests at present will also help our situation. For your information the most common symptom we are seeing in child positive cases has been a headache and cold like symptoms, if any at all and thankfully no one is really poorly. I myself have just tested positive, having had no symptoms at all and found out through regular lateral flow testing. I am currently working remotely and can be contacted through the school office. Mrs Tyrka as senior teacher and Mrs Sowray are in charge on site in my absence should you need anything at all. I am hopeful that numbers are now decreasing and we ask all to continue being super vigilant and cautious.

We have had another busy fortnight, last week was Anti Bullying Week, following this year's theme ONE KIND WORD and last Friday our MoneyMakers pupil voice group arranged a much enjoyed Children in Need day in school. Many children enjoyed wearing something spotty/ non uniform and loved buying a 'spotty - Smarties breaktime treat'. Thank you to all for supporting such a worthwhile cause.



In Collective Worship this week we welcomed Rev David the new Vicar at St Cuthbert's to our Sessay family. The children enjoyed a Zoom whole school Collective Worship on our theme 'Hope' and we look forward to many occasions where Rev David will contribute to our special services at St Cuthbert's throughout the year. Many children have been enjoying the KS1 and KS2 Christmas craft clubs this half term with some beautiful Christmas creations being produced. Thank you to Mrs Bennison, Mrs Sowray and Miss Southward for running these.



Also thank you for your Blue Bags 2 School this week and of course your Christmas hamper donations today. As you know we have had to postpone the Christmas Fair until Monday 13th December, however, we will still be drawing the Christmas Hamper Raffle on Friday 3rd as advertised in our Friday Celebration Assembly on Zoom.

Last week Byland enjoyed their trip to The Moors Centre in Danby for their 'One Snowy Night' Day. They went on a walk around the grounds to find the animals and then took them back to Percy's yurt for a hot chocolate whilst

listening to the story. In Science, they have been learning about nocturnal animals and what different animals eat, and in topic they have been learning about the continents of the world and have been singing a song to remember them!



Fountains have been finding out about plants and animals that live in different habitats. For Anti – bullying week, every child was given a kindness task to complete last week; Mrs Sowray sends a huge thank you for all the lovely photos and videos that have been sent in. In French, they have been working on short conversations and loved learning the 'Bonjour' song.

In maths they have started multiplication and have been arranging numbers in arrays. They have been doing lots of writing - in geography fact files all about Scotland and in English, diary entries based on their class text. Music has been great fun, learning how to play 'Little Donkey' on the recorder.

Bolton have been finding out some of their own family stories and writing them in their own words, they have loved learning about each other's families and all of the amazing things they have done! This week they have enjoyed looking at biographies. The children have enjoyed being scientists, investigating conductors and insulators and in Geography they have asked themselves 'Would you like to live on a mountain?' In maths they have continued looking at division and using the inverse operation, they are now applying their understanding to work out some tricky word problems. In PSHE they thought about how they could make sure our school was an anti-bullying zone! They continue to enjoy learning and performing some French rhymes in their French lessons and in RE they have learned all about the life of Guru Nanak who was the first Sikh Guru and are now moving on to learning all about the Christian time of expectant waiting - advent.



Rievaulx have been comparing and ordering fractions last week and have now started to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator. In English they have been researching how chocolate is made and writing an explanation text so that they can explain to everyone the process from bean to bar and they have thoroughly enjoyed designing the packaging! In science the children have been learning about electricity and they all enjoyed a Zoom session with 'Powerdown Pete' who taught them all about how we can save energy.
