Your fortnightly note from your Headteacher ...

I can't believe we are already in February and it has been another busy fortnight in school.

Byland children have continued to enjoy their dinosaur topic and have been making their own timeline showing when the different dinosaurs lived. They have thoroughly enjoyed their class story, Harry and his Bucketful of Dinosaurs, and have designed a new dinosaur toy for Harry's bucket. In Science, they have tested different materials to see which material would be suitable for an umbrella to keep Teddy dry.

To celebrate Chinese New Year the children made their own paper plate tigers as 2022 is the year of the tiger!





Fountains children have been designing Roman shields in Art. They have consolidated their learning about pronouns in English and in Science they have thoroughly enjoyed their science experiments! The Year 2 children have been investigating bending, squashing, twisting and stretching materials and the Year 3 children thoroughly enjoyed their magnets investigation. We have some super scientists!

In R.E. they have been learning about the Koran, the Muslim holy book and how it is treated with such respect. The children have celebrated Chinese New Year by making some beautifully decorated lanterns this week which they have hung up in their classroom. In Maths, the Year 3 children have been drawing 2D shapes to the nearest centimetre and millimetre while the Year 2's have been learning about vertical lines of symmetry.





In Bolton they have been writing a balanced argument in English about whether Boudica should rebel against the Romans! In maths, they have finished off their unit on measurement and enjoyed lots of practical 'estimate the weight/volume/length' games. In French they have been looking at fruit, concentrating on their oracy skills saying which fruit they like and dislike, thinking carefully about pronunciation. They have certainly enjoyed their PE, showing off their hockey skills and getting involved in games on a bigger scale.

The class have continued to enjoy their Roman topic. They have been looking at the Roman Army, designed and created their very own shields and the highlight being acting out some of the Romans most famous battle tactics on

our playground. With Mr Houghton in Forest School they continued to build their own empires and once again enjoyed learning to play the ukulele in music. All class Bolton children have had a chance to have a go at some of their new class map puzzles, working together to complete them throughout the week. Miss Southward was so impressed with some of the discussion that she heard during this activity!







Rievaulx have been presenting their scripts based on an episode of 'Coast'. They thoroughly enjoyed filming their episodes and then evaluating their performances, we certainly have some TV presenters of the future in Rievaulx! In topic they have looked at how the coast is eroded over time and thoroughly enjoyed a virtual workshop by Yorkshire water, learning about the water cycle and how water is treated. In science they have continued with classification; sorting sweets into groups with common observable characteristics and also classifying leaves. In maths they have been comparing fractions, decimals and percentages.
