# Byland, Mrs Tyrka and Mrs Bennison.

We have had a busy fortnight in Byland. The children are really enjoying our Space topic and have designed and made moon buggies and rockets. We have learnt all about Neil Armstrong using books and iPads to help us with our research. Last week the Year 1 children turned into authors and wrote their own stories based upon our class text Whatever Next! The Reception children designed their own aliens and wrote some sentences about them. In science we have been learning about the parts of plants and sorting fruits and vegetables.

We have been busy reading lots of different types of scales in maths; measuring mass and capacity. In RE, we have been learning about different Christian symbols of belonging and in English, we have written letters as a Victorian scullery maid and this week we are writing storyboards about the life of King Charles III. The children have all designed and painted a beautiful Coronation plate.





# **Bolton, Miss Southward**

Bolton have continued to focus on fractions and decimals over the last fortnight and have been exploring tenths and hundredths. This week, we have been getting ready for the big day on Saturday and have been looking at the life of King Charles. The children wrote fabulous biographies which they are very proud of. In topic, the children have been looking at the water cycle and have created their own mini water cycle in a bag to observe the processes of evaporation, condensation and precipitation. This fits well with our science where we have been investigating the gas in fizzy drinks as part of 'States of Matter'. Finally, the children have loved learning all about the Hindu festival of Diwali and the Jewish festival of Passover and comparing the two. The highlight has been getting outside to enjoy athletics in the sunshine!

The children did a super job identifying different word classes and grammatical features in our class text. We have also enjoyed learning about King Charles III, we have incorporated his coronation into many curriculum areas, with a Coronation code- breaker maths challenge, reading comprehensions about the formalities of the ceremony, as well as researching the lives of past monarchs.
