We had a very busy last week of term with learning a song for Internet Safety Day, making Yorkshire puddings and visiting Spilman's farm, which we all really enjoyed. This week we have made pancakes and have enjoyed reading Mr Wolf's Pancakes, our new class text. On Wednesday morning we came into class to discover a letter from Mr Wolf asking us for our pancake recipes, so we wrote back to him explaining how to make them using lots of different connectives. In Science we have started our new topic on Minibeasts and we have used pastels to create some lovely pictures of different minibeasts for our class display.

We've had yet another busy couple of weeks. Just before half term, we had a fabulous African drumming workshop. All the children were involved in making up their own rhythms and learning different ways of playing the drums and everyone started making their African masks.

The Y3 children attended the KS2 Cross Country at Thirsk Secondary School, a fantastic effort from everyone who went! On Safer Internet Day, the children were learning about their digital footprints; every website or App they visit creates their own digital footprint.

In Maths, we have been learning about 2D shape – recognising properties of shapes, drawing shapes and yesterday the Y2's did a shape scavenger hunt.

In art this week, we have been designing and making our Maasai necklaces, they are so vibrant and colourful! In PSHE, we have started our new topic 'Healthy Me' and we have been thinking about different ways to keep ourselves healthy and motivated.

The children have been busy in English over the last couple of weeks writing newspapers and job advertisements all inspired by our class book Beowulf. Our trip to the Jorvik Viking centre this week inspired our writing even more and of course, the children learned so much more about Viking life! In maths, Bolton have finished their topic of shape and are now looking at position and direction- this has included lots of games like battleships! In science, the children were challenged to use their knowledge and understanding of electricity to create a character with a light up nose! In RE, we thought about how we can symbolise lent and what it means for Christians. Rev David helped us to mark the start of lent with a special Ash Wednesday service at St Cuthbert's and by putting ash crosses on some of our heads at the end of our collective worship. It has been a very busy couple of weeks, so it was nice to wind down at the end of the week with our first yoga session in PE!

This week Rievaulx have started to look at World War One poetry. They have learnt how war poets used writing as an outlet of their experiences of war and analysed a variety of poems. In French we started our new unit 'Au café' and learnt the French for many hot and cold drinks, and snacks.
