We have had another busy couple of weeks. We have made maps and learnt all about compass directions in our topic. We have named the oceans and continents and looked at different climates. In maths we have been learning how to find a half and a quarter of a shape and amount and we have been looking at directions, including left and right. In science we are learning about our senses and have focused on our sense of sight. We have compared our writing and drawings completed with and without a blindfold and we have written our names in braille.
