- Home To School Transport. We have been asked to inform you that North Yorkshire Council commenced a
 consultation on Monday 19 February proposing changes to the Council's Home to School Travel Policy.

- Measles outbreak. We would like to inform you that there have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands and there is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best

protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.
